Corinthian Baptist youths ages 12-18 years old often participate in Rap Session every 1st and 3rd Sunday morning at 11am service. Rap session is a relaxed carefree atmosphere where each participant is taught to respect and value one another. It allows youth to share in open discussions about their day to day challenges. They are encouraged to use the bible as a guide. In these sessions they research and find answers to their struggles.

Rap session leaders keep the youth engaged not only in the Sunday sessions but also with field trips and other activities outside of the church. The leaders challenge them to think about their Christian walk. Recently, a few were asked what do you get out of Rap Session and what role do you see yourself as in the church.

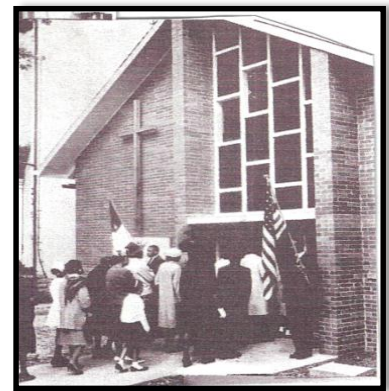

Message from the Pastor



"Worship....Work....Witness"

The theme for Corinthian is "We Worship...We Work...We Witness." Although this is our theme, it is really what is required of all Christians. As believers and followers of the Lord Jesus Christ we are commissioned and empowered to carry out the Great Commission in reaching the world for Christ. This transformational teaching should first change us so that we can be used by God to change the world.

We Worship. The word worship comes from an old English word which means worth-ship. This carries the idea that something or someone is worthy because of value. Therefore, we worship God because He is worthy, meaning He is valuable to us; He has done something for us that we could not do ourselves. He saved us!

The word worship also carries the idea of bowing down. It is an act of reverence, humility and submission. This is the posture when one is before a king. Since our God is King of Kings and Lord of Lords; Since He is valuable and worthy; We bow down before Him in worship.

Our worship is not limited to Sunday while we are at Corinthian. Worship is a lifestyle based on our attitude and is influenced by our obedience. Romans 12:1 reads, "Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship." Notice, when we as living sacrifices are willing to overlook what our flesh wants to do in order to please God, that is our true and proper worship.

We Work. We are commanded to not only worship but to work. (2 Corinthians 6:1, 2 Timothy 2:15 and Ephesians 4:12). One of my favorite verses that speaks about our work is Matthew 5:16, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." (KJV) God doesn't just want us to come to church, He also wants us to work. What work are you doing at Corinthian? God wants workers. We need workers. What has God equipped you to do? If you are a teacher then be a Sunday School teacher. If you are a singer then get in the choir. If you have the gift of hospitality then be an usher. If you like evangelism then work with the street ministry. There is work for everyone to do at Corinthian. When we work together there isn't anything we can't accomplish. In the words of Nehemiah 4:6, "So built we the wall,... for the people had a mind to work."

We Witness. Our witness is to believers inside the church and to non-believers outside the church. Our witness is seen in our worship and in our work. Our motto is "We are the friendliest church in town." But is that our witness? Does our witness reflect our friendliness? Does our witness in the community encourage people to come to Corinthian? Jesus told the apostles in Acts 1:8, "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth." Our witness begins at home (Jerusalem). At church, are you the same person your family sees at home? It is my prayer that Corinthian's worship, work, and witness will be pleasing to our heavenly Father.
