- Elyon God Most High, God is Supreme, Genesis 14:18, 19
- El Roi the God who sees me, Genesis 16:13
- Emmanuel God with us, Isaiah 7:14, Matthew 1:23
- Names/Titles in Isaiah 9:6

Arguments for the Existence of God

- Cosmological First Cause
- Teleological All creation has a purpose. Perfection. An Intelligent Designer. This argument opposes the Big Bang Theory.
- Ontological It is a logical argument based upon existence. Existing is greater than not existing. Therefore God must exist.

Faith – Hebrews 11:6, "But without faith it is impossible to please Him: for he comes to God must believe that He is (that He exist)..."

God's Attributes

Attributes describe what God is like. The only way we can know the attributes of God is from what God has revealed about Himself in the Bible. For example, the names of God are attributes that tell us something about God. Here are other attributes:

- Infinite, Eternal He is self existing, No beginning and no ending.
 Psalm 90:1-2, Colossians 1:17
- Self-Sufficient He is all He needs. He doesn't need anything outside of Himself;
- Holy God is blameless, unblemished moral purity, totally separated from sin, everything He does is righteous; Isaiah 6:1-3, Rev. 4:8, I John 1:5
- Immutable God doesn't change. Whatever He has been He is now and will always be; Exodus 3:14, Malachi 3:6, Hebrews 13:8
- Sovereign God can do whatever He wants to do. As King, He has all authority, Matthew 28:18, Romans 9:14-21
- Righteous, loving, faithful, merciful, gracious, patient, good, omnipotent, omnipresent, omniscient
