What Is the Church?

- 1. The first time the church is mention in the New Testament is in Matthew 16:18, "And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it."
- 2. The greek word for church is **ekklesia** (some times spelled ecclesia) means a called-out group or assembly.
- **3.** Romans 16:5 shows the different between the church building and the people who are the church, "*Greet also the church that meets at their house.*" Notice the church was not the building (the house). But the church was the people inside the building (the house).
- **4.** Although the church is not the building, the church always had a gathering place; Exodus 25:8, Exodus 33:7-9, Hebrews 10:24-25, Acts 20:7.
- **5.** The church is a called-out assembly of baptized believers in Jesus Christ, Romans 6:3-4, Matthew 28:19-20
- **6.** Jesus Christ is the Head and Owner of the church; Matthew 16:18, "...I will My church," Matthew 21:13, Ephesians 1:20-22, Ephesians 5:23
- 7. The church has a solid and indestructible foundation, Matthew 16:18, "...on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hell shall not prevail." Because the Rock the church is build on is Jesus
- **8.** The church is the bride of Christ, Ephesians 5:25-27, Revelation 19:7-8, Revelation 21:1-2, Matthew 25:1-13
- 9. Christ is coming back for the church.
