

Moses

- Many Bible scholars consider Moses to be the greatest prophet of the Old Testament.
- Moses name means “to pull out/draw out (from the water)”
- Moses is considered to have been the Law Giver and the Mediator of the Old Covenant
- According to Egyptian history, there is no record of Moses, the Exodus
- Exodus 12:40, 41 – 430 years to the day
- Exodus 1:8, “Now there arose up a new king over Egypt, which knew not Joseph.”
- Matthew 17:1 – 4 Transfiguration
- It is believed that Moses wrote the first 5 books of the Old Testament; Matthew 19:7 (Deuteronomy 24:1-4), Romans 9:15 (Exodus 33:9), Mark 7:10 (Leviticus 20:9), Matthew 5:33 (Numbers 30:2)
- Exodus 1:15 – 22, Hebrew 11:23 - 29
- Ten Plagues; water turned to blood (Hapi), god of the Nile
- frogs coming from the Nile River (Heket), a frog-headed goddess
- Lice from the Earth’s dust (Geb), the god of earth, House of Geb
- swarm of flies (Khepri), god of insects
- death of cattle and livestock (Hathor), god of cattle
- ashes turned to boils and sores (Isis), goddess of healing and magic

- hail in the form of fire (Nut), goddess of the sky
- locust (Seth), god of the desert
- 3 days of darkness (Ra), death of firstborn (Pharaoh), considered to be the greatest of all the Egyptian gods.
- The parting of the Red Sea is considered by many to be the greatest miracle in the Old Testament, Exodus 14:13 – 31, Psalm 136:10 - 16
