## Message from the First Lady



### “Working Together”

My husband and family tease me a lot about sports because sometimes I get confused about the different games and players. But, the one thing I know is the importance of team work. Working together reminds me of being a team. Not only are we a church family, I believe we are a team. Let me use each letter to show the importance of being a team.

## Did You Know?

Bond Hill was originally founded in 1871 as a railroad suburb and temperance community in northeastern Millcreek Township, in Hamilton County, Ohio, by the Cooperative Land and Building Association. According to a number of sources, long before the Cooperative officially named the community Bond Hill, the area known as Bond’s Hill was already familiar to local residents of northeastern Millcreek Township. The exact origin of the name Bond Hill remains something of a mystery, because the earliest records are unclear and contradictory. Newspaper articles written in 1871 reported recollections from Bond Hill’s oldest residents that Bond’s Hill was the name of the area in the 1830s. Henry and Kate Ford, early residents of the area, said that Bond Hill got its name based on where it was situated, on top of Colonel Bond’s hill. George E. Patmor, a young boy in the 1880’s, said the name was first given by visitors to a sawmill that was owned and operated by a man named Bond. Patmor also said that in those days the residents of St. Bernard and Cincinnati would use a footpath through the woods as a shortcut to access Bond’s sawmill to work or to do business. It then became a common saying that they were going up on Bond Hill, and hence the name remained.
